



- d. a signed affidavit that the individual is not precluded from Certification for reasons defined in Health and Safety Code, Section 1798.200.
  - e. payment of the appropriate Certification fee.
  - f. documentation of eligibility to challenge Certification in accordance with this policy.
2. Candidates that are not certified by the National Registry, must successfully complete the certification exam to the standards identified in Agency Policy #235.00
  3. Submit proof of completion of a California Department of Justice Background Check (DOJ).A Candidates DOJ report must be received by the Agency within thirty (30) days of the date of application. If a Candidates DOJ report is not received, the Candidate will be required to comply with any requests made by the Agency to reprocess their DOJ
- B. EMT-I Certification may be denied, or an EMT-I's Certification may be suspended or revoked if they meet any of the following:
1. has committed any sexually related offense specified under Section 290 of the Penal Code
  2. been convicted of murder, attempted murder, or murder for hire
  3. been convicted of two or more felonies
  4. is on parole or probation for any felony
  5. been convicted and released from incarceration during the preceding fifteen years of the crime of manslaughter or involuntary manslaughter
  6. been convicted and released from incarceration during the preceding ten years for any offense punishable as a felony
  7. been convicted of two misdemeanors within the preceding five years for any offense relating to the use, sale, possession, or transportation of narcotics or addictive or dangerous drugs
  8. been convicted of two misdemeanors within the preceding five years for any offense relating to force, violence, threat, or intimidation
  9. been convicted within the preceding five years of any theft related misdemeanor
  10. has committed any act within the preceding seven years involving fraud or intentional dishonesty for personal gain
- C. Upon successful completion of all items listed in V.A. of this policy, the candidate will be issued Certification for a maximum period of two (2) years. The effective date of Certification shall be the date the candidate satisfies all Certification requirements. The Certification expiration date will be the final day of the final month of the two (2) year period.
